



## **Pupil eligibility and funding rates 2022 to 2023**

This table shows how pupil premium funding is allocated to schools and local authorities. Allocations are provided on a financial year basis, based on the following pupil eligibility rates.

<b>Pupil eligibility criteria</b>	<b>Amount of funding for each primary-aged pupil per year</b>
<b>Pupils who are eligible for free school meals, or have been eligible in the past 6 years (including eligible children of families with no recourse to public funds)</b>	<b>£1385</b>
<b>Pupils who have been adopted from care or have left care</b>	<b>£2410</b>
<b>Children who are looked after by the local authority</b>	<b>£2410</b>
